ROA ANNOUNCES CLE ON USERRA SUPER TRAINING ON SUPER BOWL SUNDAY

Continuing Legal Education (CLE) course on the Uniformed Services Employment and Reemployment Rights Act (USERRA). This law is important and relevant, now more than ever, because more than 740,000 National Guard and Reserve personnel have been called to active duty since the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001.

The distinguished faculty:

Captain Samuel F. Wright, JAGC, USN (Ret.)

Samuel F. Wright is the Director of the Servicemembers Law Center at the ROA. He has been speaking and writing about reemployment rights since 1982, in one capacity or another. He spent a decade as an attorney for the United States Department of Labor (DOL). Together with one other DOL attorney (Susan M. Webman), he largely drafted the interagency task force work product that Congress enacted, with only a few changes, in 1994. He has also represented clients on this issue as a judge advocate in the Navy and Navy Reserve, as an attorney for the National Committee for Employer Support of the Guard and Reserve (ESGR), an attorney for the United States Office of Special Counsel (OSC), and an attorney in private practice.

In 1997, Captain Wright initiated the "Law Review" column in ROA's magazine and website. We invite your attention to www.roa.org/law_review. You will find more than 600 articles, mostly by Wright and mostly about USERRA and related laws. You will also find a detailed Subject Index, to facilitate finding articles about very specific topics.

Sam earned his B.A. from Northwestern University in 1973, his J.D. from the University of Houston in 1976, and his LL.M from Georgetown University in 1980. He retired from the Navy Reserve in 2007, with 37 years total service including 12 years of intermittent active duty.

Colonel George C. Aucoin, USMCR

George C. Aucoin practices law in Metairie, Louisiana, with a practice devoted almost exclusively to representing National Guard and Reserve personnel with USERRA claims against their civilian employers. He has won some notable victories, including *Duarte v. Agilent Technologies*, a case discussed in detail in Captain Wright's Law Review 172.

George earned his B.A. from The American University in Paris, France in 1981 and his J.D. from Loyola University School of Law in New Orleans, Louisiana in 1996. He is currently serving in the Marine Corps Reserve as a Colonel. He deployed to Iraq on the day after he won *Duarte v. Agilent Technologies*.
